2. Product Overview

EONE230W / EONE230B

EONE230 is a flush-mounted room thermostat based on ZigBee technology. It has a built-in humidity sensor and a function of setting the minimum and maximum set temperature. The thermostat has a programmable change of relay type and the ability to operation in heating or cooling mode. A unique feature of this thermostat is the ability to WIRELESS control (ENGO binding function) and WIRED control of devices that connect directly to the thermostat (e.g. wired control box, boiler). In order for to control thermostat wirelessly via the ENGO Smart / TUYA Smart mobile application, it must be connected to the EGATEZB Internet gateway (sold separately). Once added to the mobile app, the thermostat receives further functions, such as the ability to program schedules, time schedules or push notifications. The "ENGO binding" function provides a wireless and direct link between the thermostat and receivers (e.g. control box - ECB62ZB, control module - EMODZB or relay - EREL1ZB12A) only by using the EGATEZB gateway. ONE230 can also work as a stand-alone thermostat wired to the receiver (without cooperation with EGATEZB gateway).

Using ENGO Smart, we can manage smart home devices working on the basis of various communication standards - Zigbee, Bluetooth or Wi-Fi. We can control the equipment from anywhere. We also have the option to control several devices at the same time.

A big plus is the ability to create rules based on, among others about time, location or current air temperature. There is also an option to assign access rights to specific people - for example family members. ENGO Smart is a free app, available for both Android and iOS users.



2.2 Proper thermostat location






Please note:




4. Connection description

The EONE230W/B thermostat can function as a stand-alone wired device without connection to the EGATEZB Internet gateway. There is possibility to connect it directly to a boiler or receiver or other ENGO Controls device. Take a look at the connection diagrams to see how to properly connect the thermostat. Note: Standalone EONE thermostat, can be easily added to ENGO Smart application at any time.


4.1 Connection diagram for gas boiler




4.2 Connection diagram to pump / actuator











5. Wall mounting

To properly mount the thermostat on the wall, please follow the steps below:





Grab the top part and the bottom part to disconnect



Make sure that the wires are not under 230V AC.



Connect the thermostat according to the wiring diagram.




Put the thermostat in the box.




Screw the thermostat to the mounting box





Slide the front of the thermostat into it's back. Turn on the power. The thermostat is now ready for operation.

Devices operating on the third generation of ZigBee protocol. Communication works through an Internet gateway, providing remote control using the ENGO Smart application if the gateway is connected to the Internet.

7. About ZigBee network

7.1 ZigBee network creation and operation

ZigBee - is a wireless network based on IEEE 802.15.4 standard and it's communication takes place in the 2.4 GHz band. The network is based on a mesh topology, which allows for a very large range and high reliability. The maximum range of direct communication between two network nodes (devices) is about 100m in open space.


The devices included in the ZigBee network are divided into three types:

- coordinator there can only be one such device in each network. It acts as a connection node for all devices;
- **router (repeater)** this device is powered by 230VAC, with functionality similar to classic network routers, and it's task is to forward data packets and increase the range of the network;
- **terminal device** battery powered, sends data to the coordinator (also through the router) to which it is connected. It is usually put to sleep temporarily, which helps reduce energy consumption.

Built-in security in the ZigBee protocol (ISO-27001 and SSAE16 / ISAE 3402 Type II - SOC 2 certification) ensure high transmission reliability, detection and removal of transmission errors, as well as connectivity between established priority devices.

Four simple steps on how to properly create a ZigBee network:

- 1. Installation of the EGATEZB coordinator.
- 2. Next add any powered 230V AC device. Note to locate it as near coordinator as possible.
- **3.** Now you can increase range of the ZigBee network by adding more 230V AC powered devices.
- **4.** At the end add more battery powered devices and accesories

8.2 About ENGO Smart app (general information)

The heart of the ENGO system is its ENGO Smart app. It allows you to combine the functionality of many devices in an accessible way. It allows you to connect to devices marked with the logs "Powered by Tuya" or "Powered by Tuya: Intelligence Inside". Remote control is carried out via the Tuya cloud, which connects to the user's phone, so that the user of the device does not have to rent a server room or write software for it. Why can't the phone connect directly to the device? Such a necessity is due to the fact that it would require an appropriate router with a fixed IP address, so the cellular network will not work, and even with such a router, its configuration would be quite complicated and would require some sacrifices as regards the security of the link, because you would have to allow the devices from outside the house connected to it.

The first connection and configuration can be performed manually according to the instructions displayed in the app, but there is also an option to automatically scan for configurable devices. After that, the device automatically connects with the app and is visible on the list.

Each of the owned devices can be optionally assigned to the room in which it is located, which makes it easier to find out when our home is truly intelligent. All devices, regardless of whether they belong to specific rooms, are assigned to one of the houses that can have more than one. This assignment is not pointless, as the app knows where the device is located and can provide information about the current weather.

Thanks to this data, you can create so-called scenes, i.e. automate repetitive activities and thus save time. For example, you can set in the app that if the temperature drops below fifteen degrees, the heating will turn on or that the light will come on when the sun goes down.

But what if you need to automate something independent of the weather? The ENGO app also satisfy such a need, and it does so by using scenes that can be run with a single tap, or scenes that trigger when the state of one of the added devices changes. Example: we are leaving the house and we want the power to be cut off from the smart socket to which the iron is connected, and five minutes after that, all lights in the house turn off. It can be easily configured and started with one tap. It is similarly simple to solve the problem of turning off the light in the bedroom - if the bedside lamp is turned on, it can be set to turn off the light in the bedroom.





11.3 Guidelines for installing devices in a WiFi network


- Make sure that the Wi-Fi network where you want to install the app broadcasts in the 2.4 GHz frequency.
- We recommend turning off mobile internet (cellular data) on your phone during configuration.
- It is recommended to use the encryption of the Wi-Fi network at the WPA-Personal level.







On the EONE thermostat, hold \triangle and ∇ buttons simultaneously for 5 seconds until "PA" appears on the display. The thermostat will enter pairing mode.



Thermostat count backwards (180s).









13. ENGO Binding


The ENGO ZigBee series of devices - as the only one working on the basis of the TUYA platform - offers the so-called ENGO binding function, which allows direct binding of EONE thermostat with receivers (ECB62ZB control box, EMODZB module, EREL1ZB12A relay) using EGATEZB gateway. This makes it possible to bind devices without creating automation in the mobile application. The binding function ensures stable communication of devices online and offline (even without Internet or router connection).

13.1 Linking thermostat to the wireless control box ECB62ZB

Make sure that the ECB62ZB control box and thermostat are in the same ZigBee network (they are added to the same gateway EGATEZB) and the POWER LED lights up blue.




In order to correctly link thermostat with the control box, first select the zone in the control box with the SELECT button (1) (zone which you want to link with thermostat). The LED (2) will flash 3 times for the selected zone. Confirm your selection by clicking PAIR button (2). The LED (2) will flash green with the previously selected zone - binding process has started, it is active for 10 minutes and during this time you can link thermostat with the selected zone.



On the EONE thermostat, hold



To properly bind thermostat with the module first click quickly the button on the device 5 times. The LED diode will start flashing slowly on red, which means the device will enable binding mode.



On the EONE thermostat, hold ▲ and ▼ buttons at the same time for 10 seconds until the "bind" function appears.



Release the keys, binding function (process of linking thermostat) is active.



The "binding" process takes up to 300 seconds.



After successfull binding operation "End" message will be displayed. The LED on the module will stop flashing.



Both devices have been successfully linked. Thermostat displays the main screen, icon ^{((*)}) appeared on the screen indicating connection with the receiver.

14. Thermostat opperation in the app - ONLINE

14.1 General information

In this chapter, you can learn how to use the Engo One thermostat in connection with the ENGO Smart app. To be able to control the thermostat via the Internet, you will need an Internet connection and the ENGO Smart app. Controlling the thermostat via the app from a mobile device (IOS, Android) gives you a lot of freedom and the ability to remotely manage the temperature from anywhere.


View of the EONE thermostat menu in the ENGO Smart app:



14.3 Control

14.3.1 Setpoint temperature change


Changing the temperature setpoint is done by moving the cursor left / right in the app. On the screen, the actual temperature setpoint is represented by the number displayed in larger font.



Enter the thermostat interface.

Make a new temperature setting by moving the slider along the bar.


The thermostat started sending a signal for heating, which was signaled by a change of working status to "Heating"...



...and the heating icon appears on the display of the thermostat.

14.3.2 "Power" function


In this option, the user can turn ON / OFF the thermostat from the app without the need to interfere with the power wire. To do so, please follow the steps below:



Enter the thermostat interface.




Select the "Control" option.



You can turn the thermostat on / off by using "Power" slider



When the "Power" slider is grayed out, then the thermostat is off...




...and its display is blank.



Press the button to light up the screen. The message "OFF" will be displayed, which indicates the status of the thermostat off. If you want to switch the thermsotat back on, move the ON/OFF slider at the application or hold the OK button on the thermostat for 5 seconds.

14.3.3 Manual mode

In the manual mode, the thermostat will maintain the temperature setpoint until the user changes it again via the app or thermostat, or selects a new operating mode in the app. To set the manual mode, follow the steps below:




14.3.4 Schedule mode

The ZigBee thermostat allows you to set schedules. When creating a schedule, the time of its commencement along with the set temperature is given. A maximum of 6 switching points can be set for each day of the week.

To activate the schedule, press the schedule icon in the "Work modes" place. Once activated, the status of the thermostat will update to "Schedule".

When the anti-freeze (FROST) mode is active, a snowflake icon is displayed on the thermostat. External temperature sensor (as an air sensor) - if an external sensor is connected to the S1/S2 terminals and selected external sensor, the thermostat will display the temperature from this sensor ignoring the internal sensor. The external temperature sensor can be used in case where the thermostat need to be in other place than controlled room.



External voltage-free contact (ON/OFF) or occupancy sensor - an external volt-free contact is connected to the S1/S2 input (e.g. hotel card, occupancy sensor). When S1/S2 contacts are closed, thermostat is in normal operation mode e.g. schedule mode or manual mode. When S1/S2 contacts are opened, thermostat activates STANDBY mode (in heating mode maintains a setpoint of 5°C, and in cooling mode thermostat is OFF)





14.4.8 Control type (algorithm)

HYSTERESIS ALGORITHM uses a temperature difference (against setpoint temperature) to switch heating device ON and OFF. If thermostat works over hysteresis and it is used in a slow response system (e.g. underfloor heating), cycles of underheating and overheating cannot be avoided. It is difficult to maintain a constant temperature in the room because the thermostat is activated when the temperature drops below the setpoint temperature. In a system with high thermal inertia, the room temperature may still drop after the thermostat is turned on. Conversely, the thermostat switches off when the temperature is higher than the preset temperature. After the thermostat is turned off, the room temperature continues to rise because the heated concrete floor has to give off heat to the surroundings. The hysteresis value can be changed in steps of 0.1 from \pm 0.1°C to \pm 0.5°C - the lower the value, the thermostat will react faster to temperature changes in the room. For example, if you set the temperature to 20°C and if the hysteresis is 0.5°C, the heating will be turned on when the temperature drops to 19.5°C and turned off when the temperature reaches 20.5°C.

TPI ALGORITHM works differently compared to the hysteresis. It selects "a few or a dozen or so minute time pulses" for switching on and off the heating device in such a way as to maintain the room temperature closest to the set values. Even when the temperature has been reached, it heats up with impulses anyway to maintain comfort in the room. TPI (Time Proporcional and Integral) is an algorithm with a simple memory in its software, thanks to which it "learns" how the temperatures in the room are achieved and maintained. It has the basic computing ability: it "works" with collected data and current temperatures, "predicting" how long heat must be supplied (heating must be on). This is a kind of "intelligent control" as the heat supply takes long enough to reach the set point and turns off, increasing energy efficiency. TPI works according to cycles, the length of which is measured in amounts per hour. During normal use, you can see that the thermostat works shorter as it approaches the set temperature. Once the set point is reached, the thermostat run times become short in order to maintain the temperature. In the EONE thermostat, you can select the TPI algorithm for a specific type of heating (floor, radiator or electric).




14.4.9 Comfort warm floor function

This function helps to keep the floor warm, even if the room is warm enough and there is no need to turn on the heating. User can select 5 levels of warm floor feature. For small rooms with short loops that can be heated quickly, level 1 is dedicated. For large rooms with long loops level 5 is dedicated. For your own convenience, activate the parameter and choose the level that suits you, but keep in mind the economy of using this function.

- INACTIVE by default this function is disabled
- If the thermostat doesn't send a signal for 60 minut's then:
- **LEVEL 1** heating will be on for 7 minutes.
- LEVEL 2 heating will be on for 11 minutes.
- LEVEL 3 heating will be on for 15 minutes.
- LEVEL 4 heating will be on for 19 minutes.
- LEVEL 5 heating will be on for 23 minutes.

After the comfort floor function forcibly turns on the heating (for 7 or 11 or 15 or 19 or 23 minutes), the thermostat will wait another 60 minutes and check whether or not heating was requested during this time. If the thermostat doesn't note a heating demand in the last 60 minutes minutes, it will again turn on forced heating according to the set of comfort floor level, etc.



14.4.10 Valve protection

Valve protection function is intended to protect thermostatic valves against getting stuck or jamming (e.g. in summer time when heating system is disabled). If thermostat doesn't send a signal for heating for a period of 7 days, then heating is turned on for a very short period of time just to move the actuators



valve protection.

14.4.11 Internal relay

The 230V-powered EONE thermostat has a built-in relay, which allows wired control of, for example, a gas boiler, circulating pump, or cooperation with a wired control box.




20. Cleaning and Maintenance

The EONE thermostat does not require any special maintenance. Do not use brushes, washers or other tools that may scratch the surface of the thermostat for cleaning and maintenance of the surface, and do not use abrasive or foaming agents, as well as aggressive substances containing acids, chlorine or its compounds, solvents or bleaching agents, as this may damage the thermostat. After washing the surface, you can gently polish it with a soft, dry cloth. There are no user serviceable / replaceable parts inside.
